Either of the following is required:

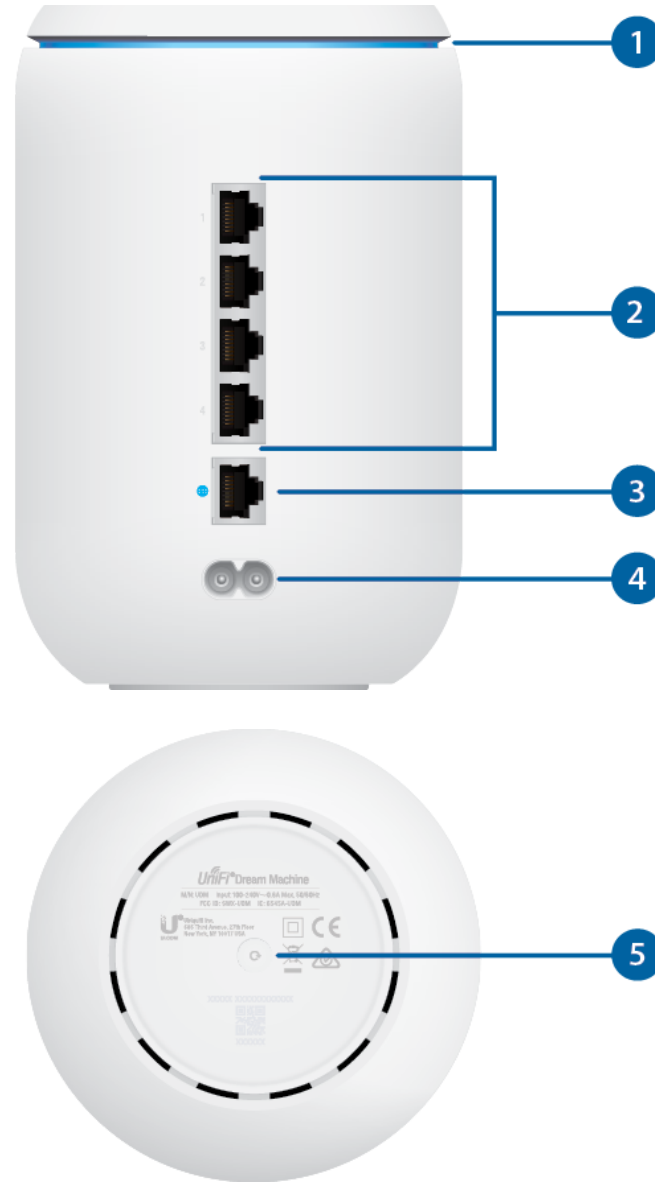
- iOS or Android™ Mobile Device with UniFi Network App Installed
- Web Browser: Google Chrome (Other browsers may have limited functionality)

1 System LED

Flashing White	Device is booting up Device is initializing/deinitializing
Heartbeat White	Firmware update in process
Blue	Device is configured and ready
Slow Flashing Blue	Client connected to device via Bluetooth (BLE)
Flashing Off/White/Blue	Device is in recovery mode. The LED will cycle through a pattern at one-second intervals, between off, white, and blue.
2 LAN (Ports 1-4)	
RJ45 switch ports support 10/100/1000 Ethernet connections for the LAN (Local Area Network). By default, they are set to DHCP Server with the fallback IP address, 192.168.1.1/24.	
3 Internet Port	
The RJ45 port supports a 10/100/1000 Ethernet connection. Set to DHCP Client by default.	
4 Power Port	
Connect the included AC Power Cord.	
5 Reset Button	
Resets to factory defaults. The device should be running after bootup is complete. Press and hold the Reset button for about 10 seconds until the System LED becomes solidly lit	

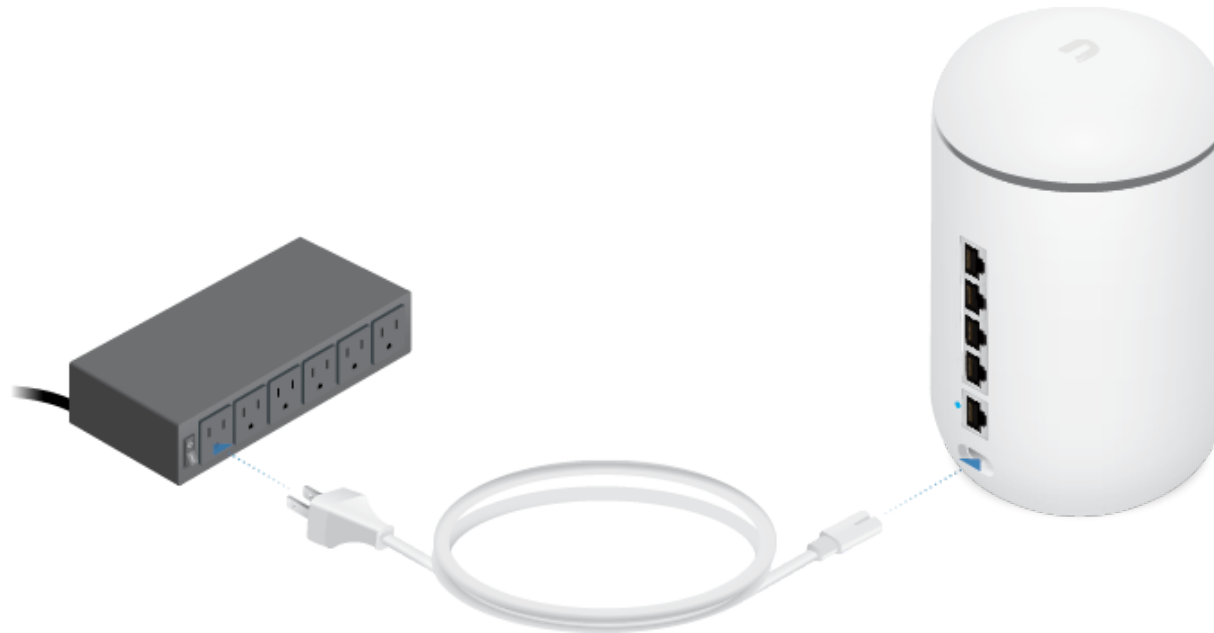

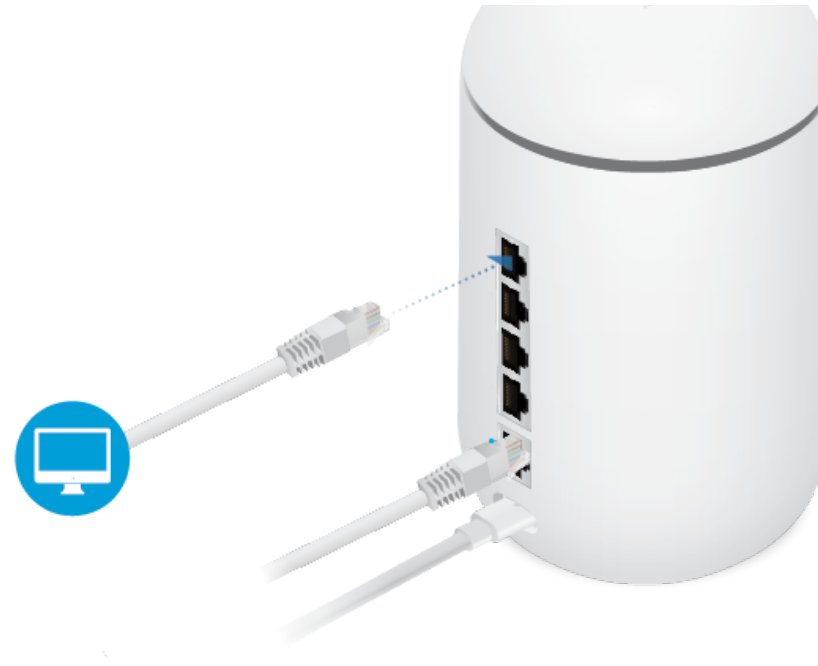

- Use a computer connected to the device on any LAN port, 1-4. Go to ["Chrome Instructions"](#).

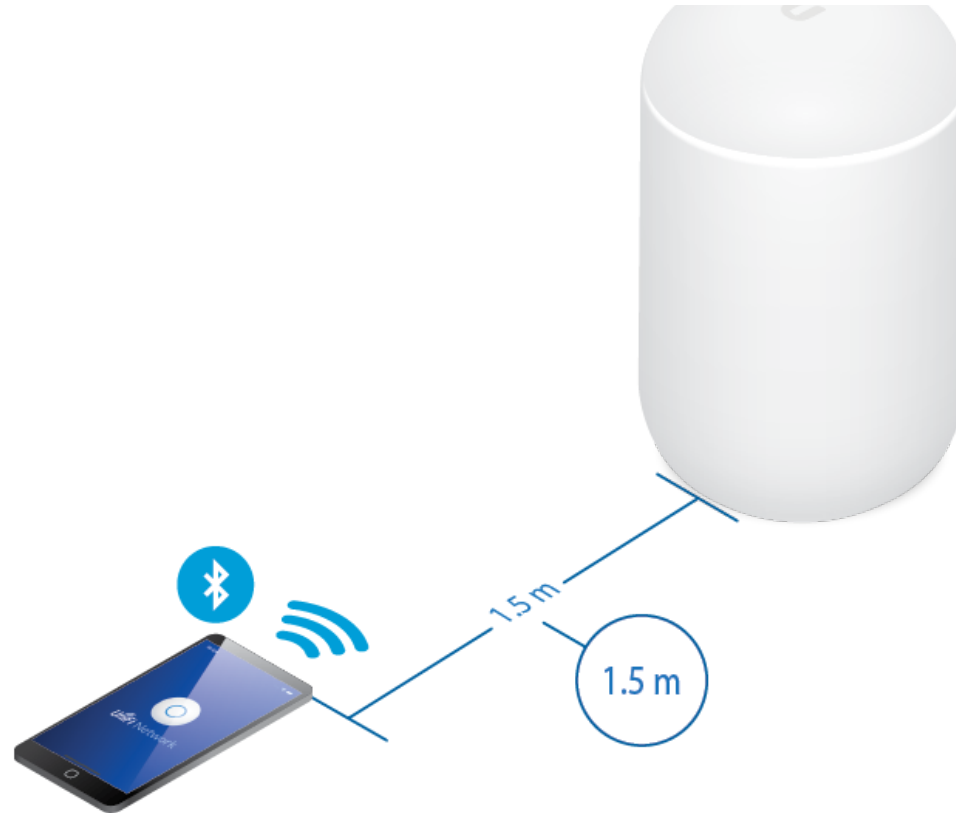
